AN ACT to amend, so far as respects the Town of *Launceston*, *An Act for the Regulation of Markets.* [31 July, 1863.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, that the Seventh Section of the Act of Council of the 5th *William* the 4th, No. 9, shall be, and the same is, so far as respects the Town of *Launceston*, hereby repealed; and the following Enactment shall be, and the same is hereby substituted in lieu thereof; that is to say,—

It shall be lawful for the Municipal Council of the Town of *Launceston*, at any time or times, either by public auction or private contract, to let out to farm, under such conditions as the said Council shall think proper, the whole of the moneys to arise from the Tolls, Stallage, and Standings of the *Launceston* Market for any term not exceeding Three Years. Letting the Tolls. &c. to farm.
