

AN ACT to amend *The Licensing Act*, 21 Vict. No. 39, as regards Manufacturers' Licences. [22 October, 1869.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, that from and after the passing of this Act it shall be lawful for any person to sell Cider, Perry, or Wines of his own manufacture from Apples, Pears, or other Fruit grown in this Colony, in quantities not less than Two Gallons, without obtaining a Manufacturer's Licence.
