

AN ACT to amend the Law relating to A.D. 1887. [21 *November*, 1887.] Railways.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 In this Act-

Interpretation.

The term "Railway" means the whole or any portion of a Railway or Tramway:

The term "Company" means any Company or person constructing, maintaining, or working a Railway in Tasmania, and includes the Manager of any Railway constructed, maintained, or worked out of moneys provided by Parlia-

2 If any person shall be or pass upon any Railway, except for the Penalty for purpose of crossing the same at any authorised crossing, after having trespasses on once received warning by the Company which works such Railway, or by any of their agents or servants, not to go or pass thereon, every c. 119, s. 23. person so offending shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Forty Shillings for every such offence.

3 The provisions of this Act shall be in addition to, and not in This Act to be derogation of, the powers conferred by any previous Acts, and may be in addition to read and construed therewith former Acts. read and construed therewith.
