AN ACT to enable the Corporation of Hobart A.D. 1876.

Town to borrow a further Sum of Money on the Credit of the Municipal Rates for the purpose of defraying the Balance of the Cost

incurred in completing the Construction of the Town Hall. [20 November, 1876.]

WHEREAS by the Act of Parliament of Tasmania of the 24 PREAMBLE. Victoria, No. 26, the Municipal Council of the City of Hobart Town 24 Vict. No. 26. was authorised to borrow, upon the security of any Rates levied or paid under the authority of The Hobart Town Improvement Act, any sum of money not exceeding Ten thousand Pounds for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas by the Act of Parliament of *Tasmania* of the 29 *Victoria*, 29 Vict. No. 25. No. 25, the said Municipal Council was authorised to borrow, upon the security of the said Rates, any further sum of money not exceeding Ten thousand Pounds for the purposes of completing the construction of the said Town Hall:

And whereas by the Act of Parliament of Tasmania, the 31 Victoria, 31 Vict. No. 38. No. 38, it was enacted that all mortgages of Rates theretofore made by the said Municipal Council under the said Act 29 Victoria, No. 25, 29 Vict. No. 25, should be deemed mortgages of Rates under "The Police Act, 1865," and should be valid and subsisting mortgages of such Rates:

And whereas by the Act of the Parliament of Tasmania of the 32 32 Vict. No. 27. Victoria, No. 27, it was enacted that all mortgages of Rates theretofore made by the said Municipal Council under the said first-recited Act

## Town Hall Construction.

24 Victoria, No. 26, should be deemed mortgages of Rates under "The Police Act, 1865," and should be valid and subsisting mortgages of such Rates:

And whereas the said sums of Ten thousand Pounds and Ten thousand Pounds have been raised and expended by the said Municipal Council, pursuant to the provisions of the said recited Acts, in the erection and construction of a Town Hall:

And whereas the whole cost of the said Town Hall amounted to the sum of Twenty-five thousand Pounds, whereof a sum of Two thousand Pounds has been defrayed by the said Municipal Council out of their revenue, and it is expedient that the said Municipal Council should be authorised to raise a further sum of Three thousand Pounds for the purpose of discharging the balance of the said cost:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Council may borrow £3000.

1 It shall be lawful for the Municipal Council of the City of Hobart Town to borrow, upon the security of any Rates levied or paid under the authority of "The Police Act, 1865," any sum or sums of money not exceeding Three thousand Pounds, (over and above the said sum of Ten thousand Pounds under the Act of the Parliament of Tasmania of the 24 Victoria, No. 26, and over and above the said further sum of Ten thousand Pounds under the Act of the Parliament of Tasmania of the 29 Victoria, No. 25), to defray the balance of the cost incurred by the said Municipal Council in erecting and constructing the said Town Hall.

Savings Banks may lend.

2 It shall be lawful for the Trustees for the time being of any Bank for Savings in *Tasmania* now established or hereafter to be established to advance and lend to the said Municipal Council, upon the security aforesaid, any part of the said sum of Three thousand Pounds which the Council is authorised to borrow under this Act, anything in the Act of Council of the 12 *Victoria*, No. 1, to the contrary notwithstanding.

Acts to be read together.

3 This Act and the said Acts of Parliament of Tasmania of the 24 Victoria, No. 26, of the 29 Victoria, No. 25, of the 31 Victoria, No. 38, and of the 32 Victoria, No. 27, shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act.
