AN ACT to enable the Governor in Council to A.D. 1879.
prohibit the Importation of Diseased Grape-
vines and Grape-vine Cuttings.

[5 May, 1879.]

WHEREAS it is desirable to prevent the introduction into *Tasmania* of Diseases in Grape-vines: PREAMBLE.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 In this Act—

Interpretation.

“Grape-vines” includes Grape-vine cuttings, Grape-vine leaves, and any part of Grape-vines.

2 The Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Gazette* from time to time, prohibit or restrict the importation into *Tasmania* of Grape-vines, generally, or from any place or places to be named in such Proclamation, and every such Proclamation may alter or revoke; and while any such Proclamation shall be in force the importation of Grape-vines, or such importation contrary to the tenor of such Proclamation, shall be deemed to be prohibited or restricted, as the case may be, within the meaning of any Law now or hereafter to be in force relating to Customs; and if any such Grape-vines be imported or brought into *Tasmania*, then and in every such case such Grape-vines, and every package or covering in which the same may be contained, shall be forfeited, and shall be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Colonial Treasurer may direct.

The importation of Grape-vines, &c. may be prohibited or restricted.
