

AN ACT to enable the Governor in Council to A.D. 1879. prohibit the Importation of Diseased Grapevines and Grape-vine Cuttings.

[5 May, 1879.]

WHEREAS it is desirable to prevent the introduction into Tasmania PREAMBLE. of Diseases in Grape-vines:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 In this Act—

Interpretation.

- "Grape-vines" includes Grape-vine cuttings, Grape-vine leaves, and any part of Grape-vines.
- 2 The Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Theimportation of Gazette from time to time, prohibit or restrict the importation into Grape-vines, &c. Tasmania of Grape-vines, generally, or from any place or places to may be prohibited be named in such Proclamation, and every such Proclamation may alter or revoke; and while any such Proclamation shall be in force the importation of Grape-vines, or such importation contrary to the tenor of such Proclamation, shall be deemed to be prohibited or restricted, as the case may be, within the meaning of any Law now or hereafter to be in force relating to Customs; and if any such Grape-vines be imported or brought into Tasmania, then and in every such case such Grape-vines, and every package or covering in which the same may be contained, shall be forfeited, and shall be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Colonial Treasurer may direct.
