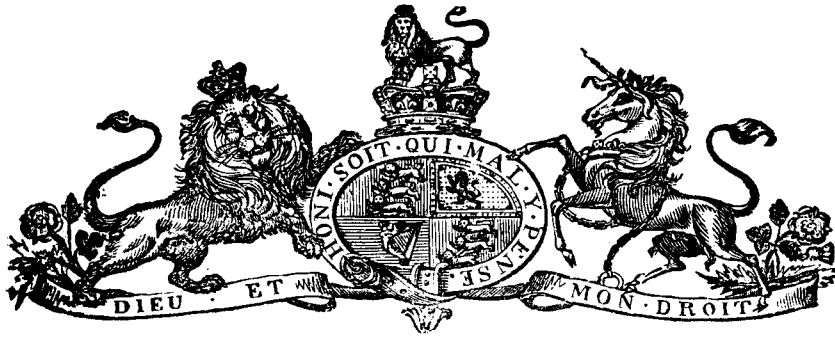

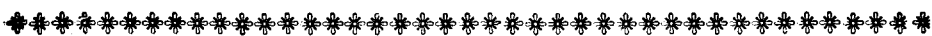

AN ACT to further amend "The Contagious Diseases Act, 1879." [6 November, 1882.] A.D. 1882.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

- 1 In the construction of this Act "the said Act" means "The Contagious Diseases Act, 1879." Interpretation.
42 Vict. No. 36.
- 2 The term "Police Magistrate" used in the said Act includes Stipendiary Magistrates, the Mayors of *Hobart* and *Launceston* respectively, and the Warden of each Rural Municipality. Term "Police Magistrate" enlarged.
- 3 The complaint on oath mentioned in the Sixth Section of the said Act may be made by any Superintendent of Police. Amendment of Section 6 of 42 Vict. No. 36.
- 4 The submission in writing mentioned in the Ninth Section of the said Act may be signed by any female therein mentioned in the presence of any officer appointed under the said Act, and every such submission signed in the presence of a Police Magistrate or such officer shall be a sufficient authority to all persons for the detention of such female in a Hospital for medical treatment until she shall have recovered from the said disease. Signature and effect of "submission" for treatment.
- 5 Sections Two and Three of the said Act, and Section Two of the Act of the Parliament of *Tasmania* of the 45th *Victoria*, No. 23, are hereby repealed. Repeal.
- 6 "The Contagious Diseases Acts, 1879 to 1881," as amended by this Act, and this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act. Acts to be read together.
- 7 This Act and the said Acts may be cited together as "The Contagious Diseases Acts, 1879 to 1882." Citation of Acts.
