Jurors' book only to be used.

II. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the names of persons as Jurors shall be taken from such Book only and so from year to year from the Jurors' Book for the appropriate current year and no other persons shall be summoned or returned as Jurors under this Act in any case whatever.

Certain parts of 5 W. 4, No. 11, relating to Jurors' Book repealed.

III. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that from and after this Act shall take effect so much of the said Act of the Fifth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty as directs that a true copy of the Jurors' Book thereby directed to be made up shall at such times as therein mentioned be delivered by the Sheriff into the Office of the Supreme Court and as directs that the names of persons as Jurors shall be taken from such last-mentioned Book only shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that so much of the of 5 W. 4, No. 11, said Act of the Fifth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty as is not and this Act to be repealed and the said hereinbefore recited Act and the present Act shall construed as one. be applied and construed in such and the same manner as if the same together formed but one Act.
