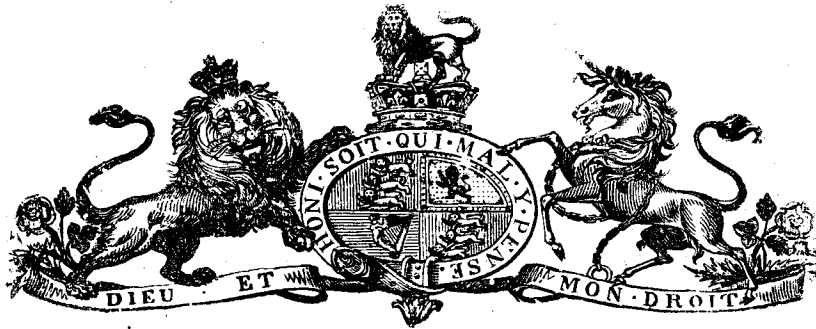

AN ACT to obviate any doubts which might otherwise arise in reference to certain Regulations made under "The Mining Act, 1900." [7 November, 1901.] A.D. 1901.

WHEREAS certain Regulations were made under "The Mining Act, 1900," on the Seventh day of *June*, One thousand nine hundred and one, and published in *The Hobart Gazette* on the Eleventh day of *June*, One thousand nine hundred and one, and were laid before both Houses of Parliament on the Sixth day of *August*, One thousand nine hundred and one

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

Failure to lay
Regulations
before Parliament
not to invalidate
same.

1 No objection whatever shall be made or taken, or shall be of any validity or effect if made or taken, to the Regulations aforesaid, nor shall the validity of such Regulations be questioned or affected on the ground that they were not laid before both Houses of Parliament within Fourteen days from the making thereof.
