

AN ACT to provide for the Payment of a A.D. 1884. Pension to John Whitefoord, Esquire. [24 November, 1884.]

W HEREAS John Whitefoord, Esquire, a Recorder of the Colony PREAMBLE. of *Tasmania*, Commissioner in Bankruptcy at *Launceston*, and Commissioner of the Courts of Requests appointed to be held at *Launceston*, *Evandale*, *Longford*, *Westbury*, and *Deloraine* respectively, was appointed to the Civil Service of *Tasmania* on the First day of October, 1833, and has since continuously and faithfully served in the

several offices to which he has from time to time been appointed: And whereas it is expedient that the said *John Whitefoord* be permitted to retire from the said Civil Service with a Pension as hereinafter provided :

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and

1 There shall be payable out of "The Consolidated Revenue Fund" Annual Pension to the said John Whitefoord, Esquire, an annual Pension of Six of £600 payable hundred Pounds during his life; and such Pension shall be payable to John White-and paid quarterly commencing from the day upon which he shall retire foord, Esquire. from the said Civil Service.

Treasurer to pay Pension upon Warrant of the Governor.

In case of death, payment of proportionate part of Pension to personal representative. 2 The Governor shall, from time to time, issue his Warrant to the Treasurer for the payment of the said Pension, and the same shall thereupon be paid by the said Treasurer to the said *John Whitefoord*, or to such person as he from time to time, by writing under his hand, appoints to receive the same.

3 It shall be lawful for the Governor, by Warrant under his hand, in case of the death of the said *John Whitefoord* during the currency of any quarter of any year, to direct payment to be made to his personal representative of a proportionate part of such Pension up to the day of his death.
