By His Excellency SIR JOHN FRANKLIN, Knight Commander of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Knight of the Greek Order of the Redeemer, and a Captain in Her Majesty's Royal Navy, Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies, with the advice of the Legislative Council.

AN ACT to provide for the Payment of the Salary of the Person to be appointed Bishop of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies.

W HEREAS it is in contemplation of Her Majesty to erect Van PREAMBLE. Diemen's Land and its Dependencies into a separate and independent See and it is expedient that a fixed sum shall be paid to the Bishop to be appointed by Her Majesty to the said See and to his successors under whatsoever title Her Majesty may be pleased to appoint such Bishop such sum to be charged upon and payable out of the revenues received from the Customs payable in this Colony—BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by His Excellency SIR JOHN FRANKLIN Knight Commander of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order Knight of the Greek Order of the Redeemer and a Captain in Her Majesty's Royal Navy Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies by and with the advice of the Legislative Council that it Lieutenant-Goshall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor or other Officer for the time vernor empowered being administering the Government of this Colony by warrant under to direct the payhis hand to direct the Colonial Treasurer to pay such Bishop so appointed or to be appointed and to his successors as aforesaid the sum of person appointed Eight Hundred Pounds per annum in such proportions and at such Bishop. times as the said Lieutenant-Governor or other Officer administering the Government of Van Diemen's Land as aforesaid shall deem proper and that the payment so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the revenues received from the Customs payable in this Colony.

Indemnity to Treasurer for making such payment.

II. AND BE IT ENACTED that the said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums so paid by him in obedience to any such Warrant or Warrants as aforesaid and every such Warrant shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for every sum of money mentioned in such Warrant or Warrants and paid by him in obedience thereto.
