AN ACT further to amend the Act of Council, intituled An Act to provide for the Registration

of Deeds, Wills, Judgments, and Conveyances affecting Real Property. [21 September, 1864.]

E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 The Governor may appoint some fit and proper person to be the Governor may Deputy Registrar of Deeds; and the person so appointed shall, during appoint Deputy such time or times as the Registrar of Deeds may be absent, either on Registrar of such time or times as the Registrar of Deeds may be absent, either on leave or on duty or from sickness or other sufficient cause, from his office, hold and exercise all the powers and duties of the said Registrar of Deeds under the Act of Council 8th George the 4th, No. 5.

2 This Act and the said recited Act, and the Act of the Parliament Acts to be read of Tasmania of the 23rd Victoria, No. 23, shall be read and construed together. together as one and the same Act.
