

AN ACT to repeal certain Legislative Enactments which have been consolidated in several Acts of the present Session relating to certain Offences and other Matters. [31 July, 1863.]

THEREAS by Six several Acts of the present Session of the PREAMBLE. Parliament of *Tasmania*, relating respectively to Offences against the Person, Malicious Injuries to Property, Robbery, Frauds, and other similar Offences, Forgery, Coining, and Accessories and Abettors, the Legislative Enactments relating thereto have been consolidated and amended, and it is expedient to repeal the Enactments so consolidated and amended: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:

1 The several Acts and Parts of Acts in the Schedule shall continue Repeal of Acts in force in this Colony until and throughout the last day of August and Parts of Acts in the present Year, and shall from and after that day be repealed.

2 Provided that every Offence which shall have been wholly or Repealnot to affect partly committed against any of the said Acts or Parts of Acts before Offences, &c. comthis Act comes into operation shall be dealt with, inquired of, tried, determined, and punished, and every Penalty in respect of any such this Act,

Offence shall be recovered, in the same manner as if the said Acts and Parts of Acts had not been repealed; and that every act duly done, and every Warrant and other Instrument duly made or granted, before this Act comes into operation, shall continue and be of the same Force and Effect as if the said Acts and Parts of Acts had not been repealed; and that every Right, Liability, Privilege, and Protection in respect of any matter or thing committed or done before this Act comes into operation shall continue and be of the same force and effect as if the said Acts and Parts of Acts had not been repealed; and that every Action, Prosecution, and other proceeding which shall have been commenced before this Act comes into operation, or shall thereafter be commenced, in respect of any such Matter or Thing, may be prosecuted, continued, and defended in the same manner as if the said Acts and Parts of Acts had not been repealed.
