AN ACT to remove Doubts as to the right of *Francis Belstead* to claim the benefit of *The Superannuation Act* upon his retirement from the Public Service of *Tasmania*.

WHEREAS doubts exist as to whether a Superannuation Allowance in accordance with the provisions of *The Superannuation Act* can be granted to *Francis Belstead*, Esquire, upon his retirement from the offices which he now holds in the Public Service of the Colony :

PREAMBLE.

24 Vict. No. 15.

And whereas it is desirable that such doubts should be removed by Legislative enactment :

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to grant a Superannuation Allowance in accordance with the provisions of *The Superannuation Act* to *Francis Belstead*, Esquire, Secretary for Mines, upon his retirement from the Public Service of the Colony, subject, however, to all the provisions of the said Act.
