

AN ACT to remove Doubts as to the right A.D. 1897. of Francis Belstead to claim the benefit of The Superannuation Act upon his retirement from the Public Service of Tasmania.

[24 December, 1897.]

W HEREAS doubts exist as to whether a Superannuation Allowance PREAMBLE. in accordance with the provisions of The Superannuation Act can be 24 Vict. No. 15. granted to Francis Belstead, Esquire, upon his retirement from the offices which he now holds in the Public Service of the Colony:

And whereas it is desirable that such doubts should be removed by Legislative enactment:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to grant a Super-annuation Allowance in accordance with the provisions of The Super-annuation Act to Francis Belstead, Esquire, Secretary for Mines, upon 24 Vict. No. 15. his retirement from the Public Service of the Colony, subject, however, to all the provisions of the said Act.
