AN ACT to remove doubts as to the validity of Acts or Ordinances in force on the Twenty-eighth day of February One Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty-nine.

HEREAS it is expedient to declare that the Acts or Preamble. Ordinances which were in force in the Colony on the twenty-eighth day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine are still in force. BE IT THEREFORE EN-ACTED AND DECLARED by His Excellency Colonel GEORGE ARTHUR Lieutenant Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies by and with the advice of the Legislative Council that all Ordinances passed by the Governor of New South Wales with the advice of the Legislative Council and all Acts or Ordinances passed by the Lieutenant Governor of Van Diemen's Land with the advice of the Legislative Council which were in force in the Colony upon the twenty-eighth day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine shall be deemed and taken to have been in force since the said day and shall be in force for the future as if their several provisions had been particularly re-enacted by this Act.

Acts or Ordinances passed by the Governor of New South Wales and Lieu-tenant Governor of Van Diemen's Land in force on the 28th day of Feb. 1829, to be and remain in force from the said 28th day of February 1829.
