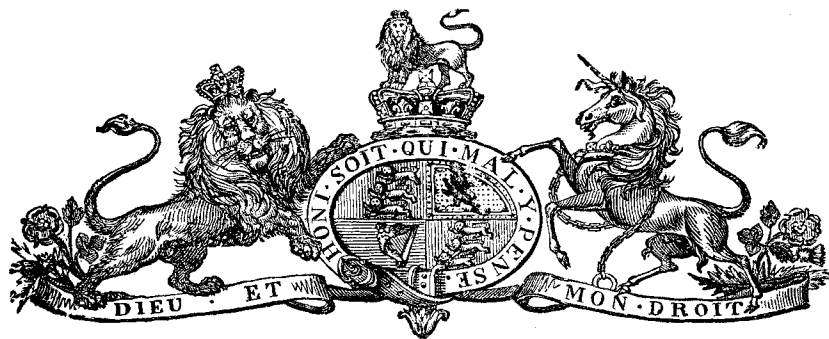

AN ACT to render Owners of Dogs liable for Injuries to Sheep. [31 July, 1863.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Law as to the Liability of the Owners of Dogs for Injuries done to Sheep by such Dogs: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*. by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

PREAMBLE.

1 The Owner of every Dog shall be liable in Damages for Injury done to any Sheep by his Dog; and it shall not be necessary for the party seeking such damages to show a previous mischievous propensity in such animal, or the Owner's knowledge of such previous mischievous propensity, or that the Injury was attributable to neglect on the part of such Owner. Such Damages shall be recoverable by the Owner of the Sheep killed or injured in any Court of competent Jurisdiction. Where the amount of the Damages claimed shall not exceed Ten pounds, the same shall be recoverable in a summary way before two or more Justices of the Peace, in the mode prescribed by *The Magistrates Summary Procedure Act*.

Owner liable for Injury done to Sheep by his Dog.

The amount of damage claimed shall not exceed £10. Same recoverable in a summary way.

2 The Occupier of any house or premises where any Dog was kept, or permitted to live or remain, at the time of such Injury, shall be deemed to be the Owner of such Dog, and shall be liable as such, unless the said Occupier can prove that he was not the Owner of such Dog at the time the Injury complained of was committed, and that such Dog was kept, or permitted to live or remain, in the said

Occupier of house or premises or part of premises where Dog kept *prima facie* deemed evidence.

house or premises without his sanction or knowledge: Provided always, that where there are more occupiers than one in any house or premises let in separate apartments, or lodgings, or otherwise, the Occupier of that particular part of the premises in which part such Dog shall have been kept, or permitted to live or remain, at the time of such Injury, shall be deemed to be the Owner of such Dog.
