

AN ACT to regulate the Expenditure of a A.D. 1887. Sum of Money to aid Mining generally. [20 *December*, 1887.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Appropriation of Tasmania in the year commencing on the 1st day of July, 1887, and money. ending the 30th day of June, 1888, a sum of money not exceeding Three thousand Pounds in aid of Mining operations in the Colony of Tasmania: Provided that not more than the sum of Seven hundred and fifty Pounds shall be expended under the authority of this Act in any one of the four Mining Divisions defined in the Schedule hereto.

2 Applications for aid to Mining under this Act shall be made to How money to be the Secretary of Mines, who shall refer such applications to a Board allotted. for determination; and such Board shall consist of the Secretary of Mines, the Inspector of Mines, and the Commissioner of Mines resident in the Division wherein the money asked for is to be expended. And no grant in aid under this Act shall be made save on the recommendation of such Board, and with the approval of the Minister.

3 All moneys paid under the authority of this Act shall be paid by Moneys payable the Treasurer to such persons in such proportions and on such days as by Warrant of the Governor, by any Warrant under his hand, from time to time Governor.

orders and directs; and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the said Colony.

Credit to be given to the Treasurer in Accounts.

4 The said Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his Accounts for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such Warrant as aforesaid; and the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same are so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for any such sums as are therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

SCHEDULE.

EASTERN MINING DIVISION.

Commencing at Anson's Bay and bounded by the eastern and north-western shores of that bay to Anson's River, thence by that river to the north boundary of 100 acres purchased by John Clifford, thence by a westerly line crossing the Wyniford River to the north boundary of 20 acres leased to John Johnston, by that boundary and by a continued westerly line for a distance of 33 chains, thence by a southerly line crossing the Frome River to the south-east angle of 40 acres leased to L. Glock, thence by a westerly line for about three miles, thence by a southerly line to the south-east angle of 80 acres leased to J. Turnbull, by the south boundary of that land and by a southerly line to the Main Creek at the south-east angle of 20 acres leased to Ah Sing, thence by that creek to the east boundary of 80 acres leased to G. M. Stevart, thence by that boundary and by a southerly line to the south-west angle of 20 acres leased to R. Davey, thence by a south-easterly line to the north-east angle of 20 acres leased to G. Evans, thence by a southerly line to Mount Victoria, thence by a south-westerly line to the River Nile at the east angle of Lot 979 purchased by James Hamilton, thence by that river to its junction with the South Esk River, thence by a southwesterly line to the Main Line Railway, by that railway southerly to the road from Oatlands to the Eastern Marshse, by that road to the Little Swanport River, by that river to Little Swanport, thence by Little Swanport and by Oyster Bay to the sea, and thence by the sea to the point of commencement. Schouten Island forms part of this District.

NORTH-EASTERN MINING DIVISION.

Commencing at the mouth of the River Brid on Bass Strait, and bounded by that river to its source, thence by a south-easterly line to Mount Maurice, thence by a south-easterly line to Mount Victoria, thence by the boundaries of the Eastern Mining District as hereinbefore defined to Anson's Bay, by the north-western and eastern shores of that bay to the sea, thence by the sea to Banhs Strait, and thence by that strait and by Bass Strait aforesaid to the point of commencement.

WESTERN MINING DIVISION.

Commencing at the mouth of the River Blythe on Bass' Strait, and bounded by that river to the "Surrey Hills Block," thence easterly along the northern boundary of that block to its north-east angle, thence southerly along the eastern boundary of that block and a continued southerly line to the Frenchman's Cap and the River Gordon, thence by a westerly line to the sea near to and south of Point Hibbs, and thence by the sea to Bass' Strait, and by that strait easterly to the point of commencement.

NORTHERN AND SOUTHERN MINING DIVISION.

All that portion of the Colony of *Tasmania* and its Dependencies which is not comprised within the boundaries of either of the Mining Divisions of the said Colony hereinbefore described.
