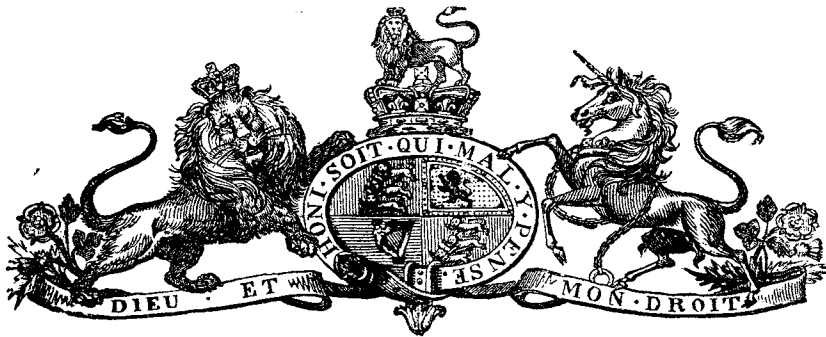

AN ACT to transfer certain Duties appertaining to the Office of Chief Police Magistrate to other Officers. [5 June, 1857.]

WHEREAS by various Acts of Council certain Powers, Authorities, and Duties are vested in and imposed on the Chief Police Magistrate: And whereas it is expedient to make other provision for the Exercise of such Powers and Authorities, and the Performance of such Duties: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

PREAMBLE.

1 It shall be lawful for the Governor with the Advice of the Executive Council, from Time to Time, to appoint a fit and proper Person as and to be the Inspector of Police, and other fit and proper Persons as and to be Deputy Inspectors of Police; and such Officers from Time to Time to remove. Governor may appoint Inspector and Deputy Inspectors of Police.

**2** On and after the Day on which it shall be notified in the *Hobart Town Gazette* that such Inspector has been so appointed, the Powers relating to the Appointment, Suspension, and Dismissal of Constables, by Section 58 of the Act of Council of the Second *Victoria*, No. 22, vested in the Chief Police Magistrate shall be transferred to and vested in the said Inspector of Police.

**3** Where by any Act of Council any other Powers or Duties are vested in or imposed on the Chief Police Magistrate, it shall be lawful for the Governor with the Advice aforesaid, by Notification in the *Hobart Town Gazette*, from Time to Time, to assign any such Powers or Duties to such Officer or Person as the Governor with the Advice aforesaid may think fit, and such Powers and Duties so assigned shall thenceforth be vested in and imposed on the Officer or Person to whom they have been so assigned.

*By notice in Gazette 859 p. 225, the powers vested in Chief Police Magistrate by 6 vic 20 p. were assigned to the Inspector of Police.*
