

AN ACT to vest a certain Street or Lane at New Norfolk in Her Majesty. [1 February, 1862.]

W HEREAS it is expedient that a certain Street or Lane at New PREAMBLE. Norfolk, in this Colony, should cease to be a Public Street, and should be vested in Her Majesty: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, that all that Street or Lane at New Norfolk of the width of fifty links Vests a Street or extending from Burnett-street to Humphrey-street, distant six chains Lane running and ninety links or thereabouts in a south-easterly direction along from Burnett-street to Hum-Burnett-street from George-street, and bounded on the south east by phrey-street, New the Hospital Ground, and on the north west by an allotment known Norfolk, in Her as the Barrack Ground, shall, on and after the passing of this Act, become and be vested in Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors; and the said Street or Lane shall thenceforth cease to be a public and common highway and thoroughfare; and may lawfully be enclosed by walls or otherwise, and appropriated to such purposes as Her Majesty or the Governor, acting on Her Majesty's behalf, shall deem expedient.
