AN ACT to provide for the payment of a Gratuity of Seven hundred and fifty Pounds to Blanche Alice Malcolm, the widow of Douglas Harvey Malcolm, deceased. [2 June, 1943.]

WHEREAS by an Indenture dated the thirtieth day of Preamble.

June, one thousand nine hundred and forty-two,

Blanche Alice Malcolm of Hobart in this State, the widow of Douglas Harvey Malcolm, late of Scottsdale in this State, public servant, deceased, being and as the sole executrix of the will of the said Douglas Harvey Malcolm, in consideration of the sum of five shillings and of a certain indemnity specified in the said Indenture, sold to the Board of Management of the Agricultural Bank of Tasmania certain works situate at Scottsdale aforesaid and known as the Dewcrisp Dehydration Works which, immediately prior to his death, had been conducted and carried on by the said Douglas Harvey Malcolm:

Blanche Alice Malcolm Gratuity.

And whereas, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Dehydration Act*, 1942, the said works have been purchased and taken over by the Dehydration Board constituted under that Act:

And whereas the said *Blanche Alice Malcolm* sold and disposed of the said works for the consideration aforesaid for the purpose of ensuring that the operations thereof should be continued without interruption, and it is desirable that provision should now be made for payment of a further sum to the said *Blanche Alice Malcolm*:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Blanche Alice Malcolm Gratuity Act 1943.
- (2) This Act shall be incorporated with the *Dehydration* Act 1942 (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Act").

Grant of gratuity of £750 to Blanche Alice Malcolm.

2 Notwithstanding anything contained in section twelve of the Principal Act, the Board, before making the first payment into the consolidated revenue in pursuance of that section, shall deduct from the profits arising from the operation of the Dewcrisp Dehydration Works the sum of seven hundred and fifty pounds and pay the same to Blanche Alice Malcolm, the widow of Douglas Harvey Malcolm, late of Scottsdale in this State, public servant, deceased; and the provisions of the said section twelve shall be construed accordingly.
