

- (3) Any regulation made under or for the purposes of—
- (a) paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of this section, may prescribe different measures and precautions in respect of different classes of noxious insects; or
 - (b) paragraph (e) of that subsection, may prescribe different fees in respect of the inspection of different classes of animals, goods, packages, containers, or premises, or in respect of inspections carried out in different localities or places.

CHRIST COLLEGE.

No. 66 of 1951.

AN ACT to amend the *Christ College Act 1926*.
[20 November, 1951.]

PREAMBLE.

WHEREAS by "The Christ College Act 1926"* a body known as Christ College Trust was incorporated for the purpose of holding Trust property previously vested in three institutions called Christ College, The Hutchins School, and The Launceston Church of England Grammar School, and certain powers relating thereto were thereby conferred upon Christ College Trust:

And whereas it is desirable to amend "The Christ College Act 1926" by granting to Christ College Trust, in addition to the powers conferred upon it by the said Act, the further power to sell lease or otherwise alienate other lands vested

in it for The Hutchins School, to invest all or any of its funds in Debentures of a Public Company, to enlarge the Board of The Hutchins School, and to enlarge the qualifications of a Headmaster of The Hutchins School and The Launceston Church of England Grammar School.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Christ College Act 1951*. Short title and citation.

(2) “The Christ College Act 1926”*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section fourteen of the Principal Act is amended by omitting the proviso to paragraph II. thereof. Trusts of specified properties.

3 Section sixteen of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

“16. No real estate vested in Christ College Trust upon trust for any Institution comprised therein shall be sold, mortgaged, or charged, except under the direction of the Board of such Institution, and with the approval of the Trustees of Christ College; but subject thereto, Christ College Trust may sell, mortgage, or charge any real or personal estate vested in it (including all lands held by the Trust upon trust for The Hutchins School) upon such terms and conditions in all respects as it may deem advisable, notwithstanding any provisions to the contrary contained in any Act of Parliament, will, deed, or any other instrument; and Christ College Trust shall have full power and discretion to invest from time to time the funds at its disposal as it shall deem most advantageous, including the purchase of real or personal estate, and including the purchase of Debentures of a Limited Liability Company, registered in any State of the Commonwealth of Australia, and having in each of the ten years last past before the date of such investment paid a dividend at the rate of not less than Four pounds per centum on its ordinary shares; and Christ College Trust shall, when directed by the Board of The Launceston Church of England Grammar School, sell, convey, mortgage, or let the three roods of land first described in the Third Schedule of the Principal Act or any part or parts thereof for such price or prices and on such terms as such Board shall direct.” Provisions relating to the sale, &c., of real estate and the investment, &c., of funds.

4 Section thirty-nine of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

“39.—(1) The Board of the Hutchins School shall consist of nine members, of whom one shall be appointed by the Board of Christ College, three by the Visitor, and the remaining five members by The Hutchins School Old Boys’ Association Appointment of the Hutchins School Board.

from amongst its members in such manner as such Association shall determine; and all such members so appointed to the Board of The Hutchins School shall hold office for five years and thereafter until their successors are appointed; provided that no member of the lastmentioned Board shall hold office for more than ten consecutive years.

(2) The Hutchins School Old Boys' Association shall consist of such old scholars of The Hutchins School and other persons who shall have become members of that Association."

Old Scholars' Association and the Hutchins School Fund.

5 Section forty of the Principal Act is amended by omitting all the words from the beginning of that section down to and including the word "Association", second occurring, in that section.

Appointment and dismissal of headmasters.

6 Section forty-three of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from paragraph VIII. the words "and shall be a graduate of a university within the British Empire."

WIDOWS' PENSIONS.

No. 67 of 1951.

AN ACT to amend certain Acts which provide, among other things, for the payment of pensions or annuities to certain persons during their widowhood.
[21 November, 1951.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1 This Act may be cited as the *Widows' Pensions Act 1951*.

Amendment of certain enactments.

2 The several Acts specified in the first column of the schedule to this Act are amended as respectively specified in the second column of that schedule.
