



## CONSOLIDATED FUND SUPPLY ACT 1987-1988

**No. 19 of 1987**

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### SCHEDULE 1

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**AN ACT** to issue and apply out of the Consolidated Fund a sum for the service of the financial year ending on 30th June 1988, to appropriate the supplies granted by Parliament for that year, and to authorize the Treasurer to borrow money on behalf of the State.

[Royal Assent 29 April 1987]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—This Act may be cited as the *Consolidated Fund Supply* Short title.  
*Act 1987-1988.*

Commencement. 2—This Act shall commence on 1st July 1987.

Issue and application of \$450 923 000.

3—The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Fund and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to Her Majesty for the service of the financial year ending on 30th June 1988 the sum of \$450 923 000 for the purposes specified in Schedule 1.

Sum available for purposes specified in Schedule 1.

4—The sum specified in section 3 is made available to satisfy the warrants under the hand of the Governor in respect of any of the purposes specified in Schedule 1.

Power to borrow money.

5—The Treasurer may arrange for the borrowing, on behalf of the State, of—

- (a) such sums as may be authorized pursuant to the Financial Agreement; and
- (b) such other sums as may be required for the purposes of the State.

Expenditure under this Act to be included in ordinary Appropriation Act.

6—(1) The Treasurer shall incorporate all money issued and applied, or to be issued and applied, under this Act in the estimates of expenditure from the Consolidated Fund to be submitted to Parliament for the financial year ending on 30th June 1988 as if its issue and application were to be appropriated afresh by the ordinary Appropriation Act for that year.

(2) If the issue and application of any money under this Act is not so authorized, that issue and application shall be deemed, on the passing of that Appropriation Act, to have been made without lawful authority.
