



## CONSOLIDATED FUND SUPPLY ACT 1995-1996

No. 9 of 1995

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**AN ACT to make interim provision for the appropriation of money out of the Consolidated Fund for the service of the financial year ending on 30 June 1996, to authorise the Treasurer to borrow money on behalf of the State and for related purposes**

[Royal Assent 28 June 1995]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

#### Short title

1—This Act may be cited as the *Consolidated Fund Supply Act 1995-1996*.

**Commencement**

2—This Act commences on 1 July 1995.

**Issue, application and appropriation of \$769 358 000**

3—(1) In respect of the financial year ending on 30 June 1996, the Treasurer may—

- (a) issue the sum of \$769 358 000 out of the Consolidated Fund; and
- (b) apply that sum for the purposes specified in Schedule 1.

(2) The sum specified in subsection (1) is appropriated.

**Power to borrow money**

4—The Treasurer may borrow in accordance with the Financial Agreement such money as may be required for the purposes of the State.

**Inclusion of expenditure in ordinary Appropriation Act**

5—The Treasurer must incorporate in the estimates of expenditure from the Consolidated Fund set out in the Bill for the ordinary Appropriation Act for the financial year ending on 30 June 1996 all money issued and applied, or to be issued and applied, under this Act as if that issue and application were to be appropriated afresh by that Act.
