(5) Any such by-law may provide that it may be enforced by cutting off the pipe or service, or turning off the water, or by such pecuniary penalty not exceeding in any case the sum of twenty pounds, as may be prescribed.

## CROWN LANDS (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) (NO. 2).

## $11 \& 12$ GEO. VI. No. 92.

AN ACT to provide for the reinstatement of certain persons as purchasers of Crown Lands and to authorise the Governor to convey and alienate certain pieces of land. [19 December, 1947.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

Short title, citation, and incorporation.

1-(1) This Act may be cited as the Crown Lands (Miscellaneous Provisions) (No. 2) Act 1947.
(2) This Act shall be incorporated with the Crown Lands Act 1935*, in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

[^0]2-(1) The Commissioner may, with the consent of the Governor, reinstate the persons named in the first schedule as purchasers of the several areas of Crown land set opposite to their names respectively, under the provisions of the Acts regulating the sale or disposition of Crown lands under which the purchases of those areas were made respectively.
(2) Every person who has been reinstated as the purchaser of any Crown land in pursuance of subsection (1) shall be liable to pay all instalments due in respect of such land at the date of forfeiture and all instalments thereafter due in respect thereof, together with the amount of fines and charges for the cost of advertising, as provided by section seventy-two of the Principal Act, and interest at the rate of five pounds per centum per annum from the dates when such instalments became due respectively.

3 The Commissioner may permit the persons named in the second schedule to complete the purchase of the several areas of land set opposite to their names respectively; and upon second payment of the balance of purchase money into the Treasury in the name and on behalf such lands in fee simple to those persons respectively.

4 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to Nancie Power to Claire Cripps the Crown land described in the third schedule for the sum of one hundred pounds, and, upon payment of the said sum, together with survey and grant fees amounting to five pounds four shillings, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said land to the said Nancie Claire Cripps in fee simple.

5 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to Katie Burnley the Crown land described in the fourth schedule for the sum of one hundred pounds, and, upon payment of the said sum, together with survey and grant fees amounting to five pounds four shillings, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said land to the said Katie Burnley in fee simple.

6 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to George Percival Smith and Edward Harley Smith the Crown land described in the fifth schedule for the sum of one hundred and fifteen pounds, and, upon payment of the said sum, together with survey and grant fees amounting to the sum of six pounds one shilling and sixpence, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said land to the said George Percival Smith and Edward Harley Smith in fee simple.

Power to Commissioner to exchange certain lands in the town of Avoca with Arthur Francis Barney O'Connor, Cecil Karl Rashleigh Stackhouse, and Claude Freeman.

Power to Commissioner to submit for sale at auction certain land in Ulverstone.

Power to Commissioner to grant land in the ninth schedule to the Warden,
Councillors and Electors of the Municipality of Fingal.

Commissio Commissioner describe the tenth schedule to the Warden, Councillors, and Electors of the Municipality of Burnie.
Power to Commissioner to sell land described in the eleventh schedule to the Warden, Councillors, and Electors of the Municipality of Kentish.

7 Upon Arthur Francis Barney O'Connor, Cecil Kart Rashleigh Stackhouse, and Claude Freeman transferring to His Majesty all their right, title, and interest in and to the lands described in the seventh schedule, and on payment of survey and grant fees amounting to the sum of ten pounds. one shilling, it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of His said Majesty, to convey and alienate the land described in the sixth schedule to the said Arthur Francis Barney O'Connor, Cecil Karl Rashleigh Stackhouse, and Claude Freeman in fee simple.

8 The Commissioner may submit for sale at public auction the Crown land described in the eighth schedule, and upon the sale of such land the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said land to the purchaser thereof.

9 The Commissioner may grant to the Warden Councillors and Electors of the Municipality of Fingal the Crown land described in the ninth schedule, and the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said land in fee simple to the Warden Councillors and Electors of the said Municipality.

10 The Commissioner may grant to the Warden Councillors and Electors of the Municipality of Burnie the land described in the tenth schedule, and the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said land to the Warden Councillors and Electors of the said Municipality in fee simple.

11 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to the Warden Councillors and Electors of the Municipality of Kentish the Crown land described in the eleventh schedule for the sum of five pounds, and upon payment of the said sum, together with a grant fee of one pound, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said land to the Warden Councillors and Electors of the said Municipality in fee simple.

Power to Commissioner to sell land described in twelfth schedule to the trustees of the Will of
Henry Edwin Henry Edwin Button, deceased.

12 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to Harry Hadden Cummins and the Perpetual Trustees Executors and Agency Company of Tasmania Limited (in this section called "the Company"), being and as the Trustees of the Will and Codicils of Henry Edwin Button, deceased, the lands described in the twelfth schedule for the sum of four hundred pounds; and upon payment of the said sum, together with a grant fee of one pound, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, by deed of grant, convey and alienate the said lands to the said Harry Hadden Cummins and the Company in fee simple.
