AN ACT to provide for the reinstatement of certain 1945. Persons as purchasers of Crown Lands, and to authorise the Governor to convey and alienate certain pieces of land. [20 December, 1945.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:---

1-(1) This Act may be cited as the Crown Lands short title and incor-poration. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1945.

(2) This Act shall be incorporated with the *Crown Lands Act* 1935*, in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Certain persons named in first schedule, whose lands have been forfeited, may be reinstated as rurchasers.

- **2**—(1) The Commissioner may, with the consent of the Governor, reinstate the persons named in the first schedule as purchasers of the several areas of land set opposite to their names respectively, under the provisions of the Acts regulating the sale or disposition of Crown lands under which the purchases of those areas were made respectively.
- (2) Every person who has been reinstated as the purchaser of any land in pursuance of subsection (1) shall be liable to pay all instalments due in respect of such land at the date of forfeiture and all instalments thereafter due in respect thereof, together with the amount of fines and charges for the cost of advertising, as provided by section seventy-two of the Principal Act, and interest at the rate of five pounds per centum per annum from the dates when such instalments became due respectively.

Power to Commissioner to sell land described in the second schedule to Alfred Harding. **3** The Commissioner may sell by private contract to Alfred Harding the Crown land described in the second schedule for the sum of fifty pounds; and upon payment of the said sum the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said land to the said Alfred Harding in fee simple.

Power to Commissioner to sell land described in the third schedule to Elsinore Martha Geale.

4 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to *Elsinore Martha Geale* the Crown land described in the third schedule for the sum of two pounds; and upon payment of the said sum the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said land to the aforesaid *Elsinore Martha Geale*.

Power to exchange certain land in the Town of Penguin with Eric William Hales.

5 In consideration of *Eric William Hales* having transferred to His Majesty all his right, title and interest in and to the two areas of land described in the fourth schedule, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the land described in the fifth schedule to the said *Eric William Hales* in fee simple.

Power to Commissioner to sell land described in the sixth schedule to the Governors of the Strahan Cottage Hospital Union.

6 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to the Governors of the Strahan Cottage Hospital Union the Crown land described in the sixth schedule for the sum of ten pounds; and upon payment of the said sum the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said land to the said Governors in fee simple.

Power to Governor to convey to the Marine Board of Circular Head the land described in the seventh schedule.

7—(1) The Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, by deed of grant convey and alienate to the Marine Board of Circular Head (in this section referred to

as "the Board") in fee simple the reclaimed land (in this A.D. 1945. section referred to as "the said land") described in the seventh schedule.

- (2) The deed of grant of the said land shall contain the following reservations and conditions:—
 - (a) a reservation to the Crown and its servants and agents of the right to enter upon the said land at any time for the purpose of constructing, maintaining, or repairing any railway works or other public works which the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Director of Public Works, consider necessary or desirable;
 - (b) a condition that the Board shall not lease any part of the said land having a frontage on Bass Strait to any person in such a manner as to confer on such person any right to the exclusive use or occupation thereof;
 - (c) a condition that the Board may, with the consent of the Governor but not otherwise, lease the said land or any part thereof to any person for a period not exceeding three years, or, in the case of a lease for building purposes, for a period not exceeding twenty-five years, on such terms and conditions, and at such rental, as the Board may determine; and
 - (d) a condition that the Board may, with the consent of the Governor but not otherwise, sell or exchange, on such terms and conditions as the Board thinks fit, any strips or small portions of the said land which may not be required by the Board for or in connection with the laying out and use of the said land for harbour purposes.
- 8 Notwithstanding anything contained in section two Power to hundred and ninety-eight of the Launcesten Corporation Act Launceston 1941*, the Mayor, aldermen and citizens of the city of to convey Launceston may convey and surrender to His Majesty the land to His land described in the eighth schedule.
