

ANALYSIS.

- 1. Short title and incorporation with 26 Geo. V. No. 35.
- Certain persons named in first schedule whose lands have been forfeited may be reinstated as purchasers.
- 3. Certain persons named in second schedule to be permitted to complete their purchases.
- 4. Power to exchange certain lands in the Parish of Tyenna, with David Joseph Farrow.
- 5. Power to Commissioner to sell land described in the fifth schedule to Alfred Felmingham.
- 6. Power to Commissioner to sell land described in the sixth schedule to the Marine Board of Hobart.
- 7. Power to Commissioner to let Three Hummock Island to Amelia Ann Maria Nichols.

AN ACT to provide for the Reinstatement of 1935. certain Persons as Purchasers of certain Crown Lands, and to authorise the Governor to convey and alienate certain Pieces of Land. [20 December, 1935.]

DE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows: -

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Crown Lands Purchasers' Reinstatement Act 1935.

Short title and incorporation with 26 Geo. V. No. 35.

(2) This Act shall be incorporated with the Crown Lands Act 1935, in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Certain persons named in first schedule, whose lands have been forfeited, may be reinstated as purchasers.

2 The Commissioner, with the consent of the Governor, may reinstate the persons named in the first schedule as purchasers of the several lots or areas of land set opposite to their names respectively, under the provisions of the Acts regulating the sale or disposition of Crown lands under which the purchases of those lots or areas were made respectively; and thereupon such persons shall be liable to pay all instalments due upon such lands at the date of forfeiture and all instalments thereafter due thereon, together with the amount of fines and charges for the cost of advertising, as provided by section ninetysix of the Principal Act, together with interest at the rate of five pounds per centum per annum from the dates when such instalments became due respectively.

Certain persons named in second schedule to be permitted to complete their purchases.

3 The Commissioner may permit the persons named in the second schedule to complete the purchase of the several areas of land set opposite to their names respectively; and upon payment of the balance of purchase-money into the Treasury, together with a grant fee of twenty shillings, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate such lands in fee simple to those persons respectively.

Power to exchange certain lands in the Parish of Tyenna with David Joseph Farrow. Schedules 3 and 4.

4 Upon David Joseph Farrow transferring to His Majesty all his right, title, and interest in and to the lands described in the third schedule, it shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of His said Majesty, to convey and alienate the land described in the tourth schedule to the said David Joseph Farrow in fee simple.

Power to Commissioner to sell land described in the fifth schedule to Alfred Felmingham.

5 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to Alfred Felmingham the Crown land described in the fifth schedule for the sum of one hundred and twenty-five pounds; and upon payment of the said sum the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate the said land to the said Alfred Felmingham in fee simple.

Power to Commissioner to sell land described in the sixth schedule to the Marine

6 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to the Marine Board of Hobart the Crown land described in the sixth schedule for the sum of three thousand pounds; and upon payment of the said sum the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and Board of Hobart. alienate the said land to the aforesaid the Marine Board of Hobart in fee simple.

Power to Commissioner to let Three Hummock Island to Amelia Ann Maria Nichols.

7—(1) The Commissioner may let by private contract, for any term not exceeding fourteen years, the island described in the seventh schedule to the person and at the rental specified in that schedule.

(2) The lease of the said island shall be granted subject to the provisions of the Principal Act relating to leases of Crown land for grazing purposes.

THE THIRD SCHEDULE.

COUNTY OF BUCKINGHAM.

PARISH OF TYENNA. 1A. 2R. 31 2/10P. Ex-Reserved Road.

Being portion of Lot 19,832 purchased by Bertrand Launcelot Rumney and now owned by David Joseph Farrow (R.P. Act.).

Bounded on the north-west by 17 chains 92 links north-easterly in several bearings along portion of Lot 19,832 purchased by *Bertrand Launcelot Rumney* commencing at a point distant 5 chains 90 9/10 links south-easterly from the north-west angle of that lot and crossing a reserved road one chain wide on the north-east by 1 chain and a half a link south-easterly along Crown land on the south-east by 17 chains 99 links south-westerly in several bearings along portion of Lot 19,832 aforesaid re-crossing the beforementioned reserved road thence on the south-west by 1 chain 15 links north-westerly along Lot 19,689 purchased by *Walter James Jones Reynolds* to the point of commencement.

0A. OR. 6P.

Being portion of Lot 12,143 in course of being purchased from

the Crown by David Joseph Farrow.

Bounded on the north-west by 1 chain 61 2/10 links north-easterly along portion of Lot 12,143 purchased by D. J. Farrow commencing at a point distant 4 chains 44 7/10 links north-easterly from the north-east angle of Lot 19,832 purchased by Bertrand Launcelot Rumney again on the north-west by 1 chain 57 links north-easterly also along portion of Lot 12,143 aforesaid thence on the south-east by 3 chains 14 7/10 links south-westerly along Crown land to the point of commencement.
