(2) This Act shall be incorporated with the Crown Lands with 26 Geo. Act 1935, in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 The Commissioner, with the consent of the Governor, Certain permay reinstate the persons named in the first schedule as purchasers of the several lots or areas of land set opposite to their names respectively, under the provisions of the Acts as purchaseregulating the sale or disposition of Crown lands under which ers.

Crown Lands Purchasers' Reinstatement.

A.D. 1939. the purchases of these lots or areas were made respectively; and thereupon such persons shall be liable to pay all instalments due upon such lands at the date of forfeiture and all instalments thereafter due thereon, together with the amount of fines and charges for the cost of advertising, as provided by section seventy-two of the Principal Act, together with interest at the rate of five pounds per centum per annum from the dates when such instalments became due respectively.

Certain persons named in second schedule to be permitted to complete their purchases.

3 The Commissioner may permit the persons named in the second schedule to complete the purchase of the several areas of land set opposite to their names; and upon payment of the balance of purchase-money into the Treasury, together with a grant fee of twenty shillings, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, convey and alienate such lands in fee simple to those persons respectively.
