AN ACT to authorise the granting of exemption to selectors of Crown Lands who are on Active Service from covenants in relation to lands held under contract for purchase under the *Crown Lands Act 1935*. [17 June, 1941.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Crown Lands Purchasers' (War Service) Exemption Act 1941*. Short title.

(2) This Act shall be incorporated and read as one with the *Crown Lands Act 1935*. Incorporation with 26 Geo. V. No. 35.

2 In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears—

Interpretation.

“Active service” means the service of a person who, having enlisted for service outside the Commonwealth with any of His Majesty’s military, naval, or air forces has proceeded in such service outside this State.

“The present war” means the war in which His Majesty is at present engaged, and includes any hostilities arising during the continuance thereof in which His Majesty may become involved.

Power to

3—(1) Where the holder of any Crown land under contract in accordance with the *Crown Lands Act 1935* is engaged on active service in connection with the present war, the Commissioner may grant exemption to such purchaser from all or any of the covenants relating to his purchase to such extent, and for such period during the continuance of this Act, as the Commissioner may think fit.

(2) The provisions of this section shall apply in relation to any land, application for which was received by the Secretary prior to the commencement of this Act and the applicant for which is on active service.

Expiry of

4 This Act shall continue in operation during the continuance of the present war and for a period of twelve months thereafter and no longer.
