- (5) A bank by which a statement under this section is lodged shall, within seven days after lodging the statement, make payment to the Under-Treasurer of, and the Under-Treasurer may receive from that bank, an amount equal to twenty-five cents for every one hundred dollars (or part thereof) of the total of the debts as disclosed in the statement.
- (6) The payments to be made to the Under-Treasurer as provided in subsection (5) of this section are in lieu of all stamp duty otherwise payable with respect to or arising out of the vesting, as provided in this Act, of the undertakings of the existing banks in the Bank and of the undertaking of E.S.A. Savings Bank in A.N.Z. Savings Bank.
- (7) The provisions of the Stamp Duties Act 1931 do not apply to or in relation to any instrument brought into existence for the purpose of carrying out, or giving effect to, or perfecting any provision of this Act.

CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND APPROPRIATION 1970-1971.

No. 34 of 1970.

AN ACT to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a sum for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1971, and to appropriate the supplies granted by Parliament for that year. [21 October 1970.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title,

1 This Act may be cited as the Consolidated Revenue Fund Appropriation Act 1970-1971.

Issue and application of \$57,378,211.

2 The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue, and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1971, the sum of \$57,378,211.

3 The sums granted by this Act and the Consolidated Revenue Appropriation of Supply Act 1970-1971 out of the Consolidated Revenue supplies. towards making good the supply granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1971, amounting as appears by the first schedule to the sum of \$83,791,811, are appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated, as from the first day of July 1970, for the purposes and services expressed in the second schedule in relation to the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1971.
