



**CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND APPROPRIATION
1977-1978**

ANALYSIS

1. Short title.
2. Issue and application of \$223,377,959.
3. Appropriation of supplies.

AN ACT to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a sum for the service of the year ending on 30th June 1978, and to appropriate the supplies granted by Parliament for that year.

[25 October 1977]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the *Consolidated Revenue Fund Appropriation Act 1977-1978*. ^{Short title.}

Issue and application of \$223,377,959.

2 The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue, and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on 30th June 1978, the sum of \$223,377,959.

Appropriation of supplies.

3 The sums granted by this Act and the *Consolidated Revenue Fund Supply Act 1977-1978* out of the Consolidated Revenue towards making good the supply granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on 30th June 1978, amounting as appears by Schedule I to the sum of \$335,602,959, are appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated, as from 1st July 1977, for the purposes and services expressed in Schedule II in relation to the financial year ending on 30th June 1978.
