



## CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND SUPPLY ACT 1982-1983

**AN ACT** to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a sum for the service of the year ending on 30th June 1983.

[Royal Assent 28 June 1982]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—This Act may be cited as the *Consolidated Revenue Fund* Short title.  
*Supply Act 1982-1983.*

Issue and application of \$217,330,000.

**2**—There may be issued and applied towards making good the supply hereby granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on 30th June 1983 the sum of \$217,330,000 out of the Consolidated Revenue, for the purposes and services expressed in Schedule 1, and the Treasurer is authorized to issue and apply the money so authorized to be issued and applied.

Sum available for purposes specified in Schedule 1.

**3**—The sum specified in section 2 is made available to satisfy the warrants under the hand of the Governor in respect of any purposes and services set forth in Schedule 1.

Credit to be given to the Treasurer in his accounts.

**4**—The Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his accounts for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any warrant mentioned in section 3, and the receipts of the respective persons to whom any sums of money are so paid are a full and valid discharge to the Treasurer in passing his accounts for such sums as are mentioned in the receipts and he shall receive credit for them accordingly.

**AN ACT to apply out of the Loan Fund a sum for the service of the year ending on 30th June 1983.**

[Royal Assent 28 June 1982]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—This Act may be cited as the *Loan Fund Supply Act 1982-1983*. Short title. 1983.

Issue and application of \$42,000,000.

**2**—(1) The Treasurer may issue out of the Loan Fund for the service of the year ending on 30th June 1983 sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of \$42,000,000 for any purpose that—

- (a) is specified in Schedule 2 to the *Loan Fund Appropriation Act 1981-1982*; or
- (b) should, in the opinion of the Governor, be carried out in the public interest and is recommended by the Treasurer as properly to be paid for out of the Loan Fund.

(2) The application of each sum for the purposes of this section shall be determined by the Governor without any authority other than this section.

Power to borrow money.

**3**—The Treasurer may arrange for the borrowing on behalf of the State, in accordance with the Financial Agreement, of such sums as are required for the purposes of this Act.

Expenditure under this Act to be included in annual Loan Fund Appropriation Act.

**4**—(1) The Treasurer shall incorporate all moneys issued and applied, or to be issued and applied, under this Act in the estimates of expenditure from the Loan Fund to be submitted to Parliament for the year ending on 30th June 1983 as if their issue and application were to be authorized afresh by the ordinary Loan Fund Appropriation Act for that year.

(2) If the issue and application of any money under this Act is not so authorized it shall be deemed on the passing of that Act to have been done without lawful authority.



**TASMANIAN SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA**  
**(FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE)**  
**ACT 1982**

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**AN ACT to provide for the making of contributions by the State and by municipalities for the support of the Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra and for related matters.**

**[Royal Assent 30 June 1982]**

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—This Act may be cited as the *Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra* Short title.  
(*Financial Assistance*) Act 1982.

Interpretation.

**2**—In this Act, “orchestra” means the orchestra known as the Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra that was established pursuant to an agreement authorized to be executed by the *Tasmanian Orchestra (Agreement) Act 1948*.

State contribution for support of orchestra.

**3**—(1) The Minister shall, for the support of the orchestra, pay an amount not exceeding \$60 000 in each financial year in the period beginning 1st July 1982 and ending on 30th June 1985.

(2) Any amount payable under subsection (1) shall be paid by the Treasurer out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund and the amount so payable is accordingly, by virtue of this subsection, appropriated to the extent necessary.

Power of municipalities to make contributions for support of orchestra.

**4**—(1) Notwithstanding anything in the *Local Government Act 1962*, the *Hobart Corporation Act 1963*, or the *Launceston Corporation Act 1963*, a municipality may, subject to subsection (2), make contributions out of its municipal fund for the support of the orchestra.

(2) Where a municipality makes a contribution pursuant to subsection (1), such contribution shall not exceed in a financial year—

- (a) in the case of the city of Hobart, 1/10th;
- (b) in the case of the city of Launceston, 1/20th; or
- (c) in the case of any other municipality, 1/25th,

of the amount payable by the Minister in the same financial year for the support of the orchestra under this or any other Act.

Validation of certain contributions paid for support of orchestra.

**5**—Where a payment was made by the Minister or a municipality during the financial year ended on 30th June 1982 as a contribution for the support of the orchestra, that payment shall, to the extent that it could have been lawfully and properly made if—

- (a) this Act had been in force during that financial year; and
- (b) the period referred to in section 3 had begun on 1st July 1981,

be deemed to have been lawfully and properly made.
