**AN ACT to provide for the abolition of duties under the Deceased Persons' Estates Duties Act 1931 in respect of the estates of persons dying on or after 1st October 1982 and for related purposes.**

[Royal Assent 4 November 1982]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—This Act may be cited as the *Deceased Persons' Estates Duties Amendment Act* 1982. Short title.



**10—**(1) In this section, “relevant day” means the day fixed by the Governor by proclamation under subsection (2) for the purposes of this section. Provision for repeal of Principal Act, &c.

(2) On being satisfied that there is nothing relating to—

(a) the payment of duty under the Principal Act in respect of the real and personal estate of any person who died before 1st October 1982; or

(b) any other matter or thing under that Act in respect of the real and personal estate of any such person,

that makes it necessary or desirable for that Act to continue in force, the Governor shall fix by proclamation a day to be the relevant day.

(3) On the relevant day, the Principal Act is repealed.

(4) In subsection (3), “the Principal Act” includes any of the following Acts that has not been repealed before the relevant day:—

(a) the *Deceased Persons' Estates Duties Act* 1976;

(b) the *Deceased Persons' Estates Duties Act* 1977;

(c) the *Deceased Persons' Estates Duties Act* 1978;

(d) the *Deceased Persons' Estates Duties Act* (No. 2) 1978.
