

(2) The Trustees shall, upon demand being made on them by the Treasurer, pay to the Treasurer any amount paid by him to the Bank under this section, together with interest thereon at such rate as the Treasurer determines calculated from the day of payment by the Treasurer to the Bank until the payment to him by the Trustees.

(3) The rate of interest referred to in subsection (2) of this section—

(a) shall not exceed the rate of interest payable to the Bank by the Trustees in respect of the principal moneys in relation to which the payment was made by the Treasurer to the Bank or be less than that rate by more than two per cent per annum; and

(b) shall not be less than five per cent per annum.

(4) All moneys received by the Treasurer from the Trustees under this section shall be paid by him into the Consolidated Revenue.

DAYLIGHT SAVING.

No. 71 of 1971.

AN ACT to modify temporarily certain of the provisions of the *Daylight Saving Act 1968*.

[26 November 1971.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Daylight Saving Act 1971*. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Daylight Saving Act 1968*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Modification
of section 3 of
Principal Act.

2 During the continuance of this Act, the provisions of section three of the Principal Act have effect as if from subsection (1) of that section the words “second Sunday of March” were omitted and the words “last Sunday in February” were substituted therefor.

Expiry of Act.

3 This Act shall expire on the thirtieth day of September 1972.

CONSUMERS PROTECTION.

No. 72 of 1971.

AN ACT to amend the *Consumers Protection Act* 1970. [26 November 1971.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and
citation.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Consumers Protection Act* 1971.

(2) The *Consumers Protection Act* 1970 is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section six of the Principal Act is repealed and the following sections are substituted therefor:—

Area of
operations of
the Council.

“6—(1) With regard to matters affecting consumers, it is the function of the Council, in accordance with this Act, to carry out such investigations and take such other action as is provided therein.

“(2) Without prejudice to the generality of subsection (1) of this section, the prices charged for goods or services, practices used in connection with the advertising of goods and services, or in con-
