(b) to each person for the time being holding the office of puisne judge, a salary at the rate of sixteen thousand six hundred and fifty dollars a year.".

EDUCATION.

No. 10 of 1969.

AN ACT to amend the Education Act 1932.

[14 October 1969.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Education Act 1969.
- (2) The Education Act 1932, as subsequently amended, is 'n this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Capitation

- 2 Section forty-nine of the Principal Act is amended—
 - (a) by omitting from paragraph (d) of subsection private schools.

 (3) of that section the words "and 'secondary pupil'" and substituting therefor the words ', 'secondary pupil', and 'higher secondary pupil'"; and
 - (b) by omitting from subsection (5) of that section the definition of "capitation grant" and substituting therefor the following definition:-
 - "'capitation grant' means a grant that is composed of the sum of-
 - (a) twenty dollars a year in respect of
 - each primary pupil;
 (b) thirty dollars a year in respect of each secondary pupil (other than a pupil to whom paragraph (c) of this definition relates); and
 - (c) fifty dollars a year in respect of each higher secondary pupil, who is included in a school roll on the prescribed day in each year:".
