ELECTORAL.

No. 26 of 1971.

AN ACT to amend the Flectoral Act 1907.

[29 April 1971.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- **1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Electoral Act* 1971.
- (2) The Electoral Act 1907, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

The third schedule.

- 2 The third schedule to the Principal Act is amended—
 - (a) by omitting paragraph 4 of form I;
 - (b) by omitting paragraph 2 of the further declaration set out in that form and substituting therefor the following paragraphs:—
 - "* 2. I am not the holder of an office of profit or emolument by virtue of any appointment made by—
 - (a) the Governor or the Governor-in-Council; or
 - (b) a State instrumentality.
 - (Constitution Act 1934, section 32.)
 - "* 2. I am the holder of an office of profit or emolument being [here insert appointment held whether made by the Governor, the Governor-in-Council, or a State instrumentality but I am aware that, by reason of the operation of the Constitution (State Employees) Act 1944, this does not disqualify me from being elected if I cease to hold that office forthwith on my election and I propose, if elected, to cease to hold that office accordingly."; and
 - (c) by omitting paragraph 2 of the further declaration set out in form IA and substituting therefor the following paragraphs:-
 - " * 2. I am not the holder of an office of profit or emolument by virtue of any appointment made by—
 - (a) the Governor or the Governor-in-Council; or
 - (b) a State instrumentality. (Constitution Act 1934, section 32.)
 - "* 2. I am the holder of an office of profit or emolument being [here insert appointment held whether made by the Governor, the Governor-in-Council, or a State instrumentality] but I am aware

that, by reason of the operation of the Constitution (State Employees) Act 1944, this does not disqualify me from being elected if I cease to hold that office forthwith on my election and I propose, if elected, to cease to hold that office accordingly.".

PRIMARY PRODUCERS' RELIEF.
