

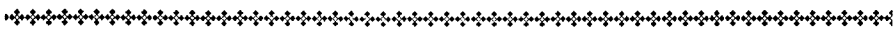

AN ACT to amend the Education Act 1932.

[16 May 1974]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Education Act 1974*.

Short title, citation, and commencement

(2) The *Education Act 1932*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3) This Act shall commence on 1st July 1974.

2 Section 46A of the Principal Act is amended—

- (a) by omitting, from subsection (2), the word “twenty-one” and substituting therefor the word “twenty-three”;
- (b) by omitting from paragraph (b) of that subsection the word “twenty” and substituting therefor the word “twenty-two”;
- (c) by omitting, from subsection (3) (a), the word “six” and substituting therefor the words “subject to subsection (3A), five”;
- (d) by inserting, after subsection (3) (a), the following paragraph:—
 - “(ab) subject to subsection (3A), two members shall be persons nominated by the Council of Advanced Education established under the *Advanced Education Act 1968*.”;
- (e) by omitting, from subsection (3) (c), the word “two” and substituting therefor the word “three” and by omitting from that paragraph the words “State School Teachers’” and substituting therefor the word “Teachers”;
- (f) by inserting, after subsection (3), the following subsection:—
 - “(3A) Notwithstanding subsection (3), from 1st July 1976 the word ‘five’ in paragraph (a) of that subsection shall be read as ‘four’ and the word ‘two’ in paragraph (ab) of that subsection shall be read as ‘three’.”.

3 Section 46B of the Principal Act is amended by omitting, from subsection (2), the word “eleven” and substituting therefor the word “twelve”.

Term of office
of certain
members.

4 Of the members of the Schools Board nominated by the Council of Advanced Education for a term commencing 1st July 1974, one of them who is specified by the Council shall retire from office after 2 years and the other shall retire from office after 4 years and each such member, if still qualified for appointment, is eligible for re-appointment as a member of the Board.
