Division 5B—Photographs 68zB—Admissibility of photographs.

AN ACT to amend the Evidence Act 1910 to make provision with respect to the admissibility of photographs in legal proceedings.

[Royal Assent 30 November 1982]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—This Act may be cited as the Evidence Amendment Act 1982. Short title.

Insertion in Part III of Evidence Act 1910 of new Division 5B. **2**—After Division 5A of Part III of the *Evidence Act* 1910*, the following Division is inserted:—

Division 5B—Photographs

Admissibility of photographs.

68ZB—Where a person who operated a camera, device, or other instrument for the purpose of photographing a scene or subject gives evidence in any legal proceeding that a photographic print (other than a transparency to which Division 5A applies) appears to be a print of the scene or subject which he photographed, the print shall, on the giving of that evidence, be admissible in evidence in that legal proceeding.
