EXPIRING LAWS CONTINUANCE.

No. 23 of 1951.

AN ACT to continue certain expiring Laws. [18 May, 1951.]

PREAMBLE.

Cf. No. 74 of 1950.

WHEREAS the Acts mentioned in the schedule to this Act are, in so far as they are in force and are temporary in their duration, limited to expire on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one:

And whereas it is expedient to provide for the continuance, as in this Act mentioned, of those Acts and of the enactments amending or affecting the same:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the Expiring Laws Continuance Act 1951.

2—(1) The Acts mentioned in the schedule shall be con-continuance of Acts in tinued until the thirty-first day of December, 1951.

(2) Any unrepealed enactments which are temporary in 1bid., s. 2. their duration shall, in so far as they amend or affect any enactment continued by the foregoing provisions of this Act, be continued in like manner as that enactment whether they are mentioned in the schedule to this Act or not.
