## FISHERIES (No. 2).

No. 54 of 1958.

AN ACT to amend the *Fisheries Act 1935*.  
[21 November 1958.]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Fisheries Act (No. 2)* 1958. Short title  
and citation.

(2) The *Fisheries Act 1935*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

**2** Section eight of the Principal Act is amended by omitting paragraph XIV of subsection (1) and substituting therefor the following paragraph:— Regulations.

“ XIV Prohibiting, either generally or for any prescribed period, the buying, selling, or offering or exposing for sale, or the having possession, of any fish (whether taken in this State or elsewhere) falling within all or any of the following classes:—

- (a) Fish, or the female of fish, or fish of less than a prescribed size, of a particular kind or species:
- (b) Undersized, unclean, or unseasonable fish: and
- (c) Fish the taking of which is contrary to the regulations:”.
