AN ACT to amend the *Fruit Board Act 1934*.  
 [16 November, 1938.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1** This Act may be cited as the *Fruit Board Act 1938*.

Short title.

**2** The Principal Act is hereby amended—

I. As to section six thereof by inserting—

(a) “(1)” (at the commencement):

(b) “And the Board may pay the like expenses and allowances to any member required to travel for the purposes of any business authorised by the Board.” (at the end of subsection (1)): and

- (c) “(2) The Board may pay out of its funds such allowance to the Chairman as the Board, with the approval of the Minister, may determine.  
 (3) The Board may pay to the Australian Apple and Pear Council such contribution or subscription as the Board may think fit.”

(at the end) :

Section 15.

II. By inserting after paragraph III. of section fifteen thereof the following new paragraphs iv. and v.—

“iv. All fees, commissions, and profits paid in respect of, or arising from, any transactions of the Board.

v. All moneys received by the Board from the Australian Apple and Pear Council.” :

Section 20.

III. As to section twenty thereof—

(a) By adding at the end of subsection (1) the words “and, with the approval of the Minister, may purchase, ship, or sell fruit, on commission or otherwise for the purpose of opening up new markets, and may charge such fees or commission in respect thereof as the Board thinks fit.”: and

(b) By deleting the words “With the assent of at least a two-thirds majority” at the beginning of subsection (3): and

Section 31.

IV. By inserting “(1)” at the commencement of section thirty-one thereof and adding at the end of that section the following new subsection (2)—

“(2) In addition to any other matters to be prescribed, the regulations may provide for the classification and grading of fruit offered for sale for consumption in this State, and may prohibit such sale otherwise than in accordance with such conditions as the Governor, on the recommendation of the Board, may prescribe.”
