AN ACT to amend the Fire Service Act 1979.

[Royal Assent 27 November 1987]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—This Act may be cited as the *Fire Service Amendment Act 1987*. Short title.

2—(1) This section and section 1 shall commence on the day on which this Act receives the Royal assent. Commencement.

(2) Except as provided in subsection (1), this Act shall commence on such day as may be fixed by proclamation.

Principal Act.

3—In this Act, the *Fire Service Act 1979** is referred to as the Principal Act.

4—After section 133 of the Principal Act, the following section is inserted:—

Appeals against
provisions of
General Fire
Regulations.

133A—(1) A person aggrieved by a requirement in any provisions of the General Fire Regulations made pursuant to section 133 relating to existing premises may appeal to the Building Appeal Board constituted under section 461B of the *Local Government Act 1962*.

(2) The provisions of section 461K of the *Local Government Act 1962* apply to an appeal made under subsection (1).
