

2. Annual pension of £300 to James Hynds Gillies.

AN ACT to provide for the Payment of a Pension to James Hynds Gillies. 1935. [20 December, 1935.]

WHEREAS James Hynds Gillies, of Hobart, in Tasmania, Preamble. Esquire, was instrumental in initiating the establishment in Tasmania of the Hydro-Electric Works now being carried on by this State:

And whereas it is desirable that, in recognition of the benefit accruing to the State from the establishment of such Hydro-Electric Works, a pension should be granted to the said James Hynds Gillies:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the Gillies' Pension Act 1935.

Gillies' Pension.

Annual pension of £300 to James Hynds Gillies.

- 2—(1) There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue to James Hynds Gillies, of Hobart, in Tasmania, Esquire, an annual pension of three hundred pounds during his life.
- (2) Such pension shall be payable monthly, as from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six.
