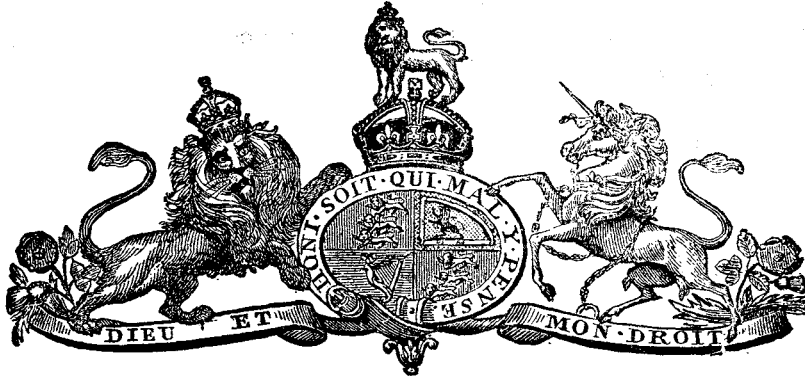

WHEREAS *James Hynds Gillies*, of Hobart, in Tasmania, Esquire, was instrumental in initiating the establishment in Tasmania of the Hydro-Electric Works now being carried on by this State : Preamble.

And whereas it is desirable that, in recognition of the benefit accruing to the State from the establishment of such Hydro-Electric Works, a pension should be granted to the said *James Hynds Gillies* :

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as the *Gillies' Pension Act 1935*.

2—(1) There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue to *James Hynds Gillies*, of Hobart, in Tasmania, Esquire, an annual pension of three hundred pounds during his life.

(2) Such pension shall be payable monthly, as from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six.
