

HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION.

No. 72 of 1954.

AN ACT to amend the *Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944.* [21 December, 1954.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title
and citation.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1954.*

(2) The *Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section sixty-two of the Principal Act is amended by adding at the end thereof the following subsections:—

“(5) The regulations under this section may adopt, either wholly or in part and either specifically or by reference, any of the standard codes, rules, or specifications of the body known as the Standards Association of Australia or of any other like body specified in the regulations, and thereupon the standard codes, rules, or specifications so adopted shall apply to electrical appliances, cables, conduits, fittings, insulators, wires, apparatus, or materials as prescribed in the regulations.

“(6) The regulations under this section may—

- (a) impose penalties not exceeding fifty pounds for breaches thereof; and
 - (b) provide that any penalties imposed for breaches of the regulations shall be paid to, and may be retained by, the Commission.”.
