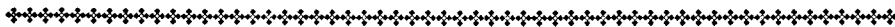

### ANALYSIS

**AN ACT to amend the Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944.**

**[11 December 1975]**

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1975*. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

**2** Section 7 of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

Allowances to  
Commissioners.

“ 7—(1) The Commissioner, or, on his death, his legal personal representative, is entitled to such allowances as may be prescribed in addition to the remuneration payable under section 6 (1).

“ (2) Each Commissioner is entitled to such allowances for his travelling expenses as may be prescribed.”.

General powers  
of Commission.

**3** Section 15 of the Principal Act is amended by omitting subsection (2A) and substituting therefor the following subsections:—

“ (2A) With the approval of the Minister, the Commission may enter into and carry out agreements with any authority or person for the construction by the Commission of any works that that authority or person may lawfully construct or for the giving of assistance by the Commission in the carrying out of any such works.

“ (2B) The Commission may enter into and carry out agreements with any authority or person for the carrying out of investigations, the preparation of designs, and the giving of other assistance by the Commission in relation to works proposed to be constructed by or on behalf of that authority or person.

“ (2C) References in subsections (2A) and (2B) to an authority shall be construed as including references to a Minister and to any person acting on behalf of the State or under any enactment.”.
