

- (e) prescribing conditions to be observed in connection with the transport of radioactive substances;
- (f) prescribing medical examinations, including blood tests, of persons exposed, or likely to be exposed, to the risk of disease due to irradiation; and
- (g) imposing penalties, not exceeding fifty pounds, for offences against the regulations.

AN ACT to amend the *Housing Improvement (Powers of Approved Institutions) Act 1946.*  
[21 September, 1954.]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Housing Improvement (Powers of Approved Institutions) Act 1954.* Short title and citation.

(2) The *Housing Improvement (Powers of Approved Institutions) Act 1946* is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

**2** Section five of the Principal Act is amended by omitting the words “one thousand five hundred pounds” and substituting therefor the words “three thousand pounds, in the case of a dwelling-house erected or proposed to be erected in an area that is prescribed as a brick area under the *Building Act 1937*, or two thousand seven hundred pounds, in any other case”.
