BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Industrial Development Act* Short title and citation.
- (2) The *Industrial Development Act* 1954*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Interpretation.

- 2 Section 3 of the Principal Act is amended—
- (a) by omitting the word "or" at the end of paragraph (a) of the definition of "industry"; and
- (b) by inserting after that paragraph of that definition the following paragraph:—
 - "(ab) for the winning, obtaining, processing, or treating of coal or minerals associated therewith; or ".
- **3** After section 9 of the Principal Act the following section is inserted:—

Development of land purchased.

- "9A—(1) For the purposes of rendering land that is acquired under section 9 suitable for industrial purposes, the Minister may carry out, or arrange for the carrying out of, the development of the land in such manner as he may determine.
- "(2) For the purposes of subsection (1) 'development' includes the construction and erection of any building or works (including the provision of equipment in respect of the building or works), the provision of services, and the provision of plant and machinery."
- "(3) This section expires at the expiration of the period of four years from its commencement.".

Repeal.

4 The Coal Mining Industry (Government Assistance) Act 1952 is repealed.
