AN ACT to amend the Railway Advances and Suspense Accounts Act 1923.
[22 April, 1947.]

B^E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Railway Advances Short title and Suspense Accounts Act 1947.
- (2) The Railway Advances and Suspense Accounts Act 1923*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- **2** Section six of the Principal Act is amended by omitting Power to the words "one hundred and eighty" and substituting borrow. therefor the words "three hundred".
- 3 Section eleven of the Principal Act is amended by Limitation to omitting the words "one hundred and eighty" and substi-on Stores tuting therefor the words "three hundred".

INDUSTRIES ESTABLISHMENT.

11 GEO. VI. No. 19.

AN ACT to amend the *Industries Establishment*Act 1946. [22 April, 1947.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Industries Establish*-Short title ment Act 1947.
- (2) The Industries Establishment Act 1946* is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Acquisition of land for new industries.

- 2 Section five of the Principal Act is amended by inserting after subsection (1) the following subsection:—
- "(1A) The powers conferred by subsection (1) shall extend to authorising the acquisition of land for the purpose of the establishment of new industries generally, notwithstanding that an agreement in respect of a new industry has not been entered into in pursuance of section four; and any land so acquired may be subsequently disposed of in accordance with this Act.".
- 3 Sections seven and eight of the Principal Act are repealed and the following sections substituted therefor:—

Expenditure on recommendation of Director. "7. No moneys shall be expended under the authority of this Act except on the recommendation of the Director of Industrial Development.

Provision for grants.

"8. Any moneys required for the purpose of making grants under this Act shall be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue.

Provision for loans and other purposes.

- "9.—(1) Any moneys required for the purposes of this Act (other than the making of grants) shall be paid out of moneys borrowed under the authority of this section or under the authority of the Acts specified in the schedule.
- (2) For the purposes specified in subsection (1) the Treasurer may raise any sum of money not exceeding £200,000.
- (3) The amounts authorised to be raised by the Acts specified in the schedule shall be deemed to be raised for the purposes of carrying out any agreements made under this Act and the provisions of this Act shall apply to the expenditure thereof.

No agreement to be made after 30th June, 1949. Schedule.

- "10. No agreement shall be made under this Act after the thirtieth day of June, 1949.".
- 4 The Principal Act is amended by adding at the end thereof the schedule set out in the schedule to this Act.
