

2 Section forty-five B of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (4) the numerals "1969" and substituting therefor the numerals "1970". Payments to clubs to assist horse-racing and coursing.

3 Section seventy-one of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from clause (A) of sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of subsection (2) the words "forty thousand dollars" and substituting therefor the words "forty-five thousand dollars". Application of commission paid by bookmakers.

JUDGES' SALARIES.

No. 9 of 1969.

AN ACT to amend the *Judges' Salaries Act 1920*.
[14 October 1969.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Judges' Salaries Act 1969*. Short title, citation, and commencement.

(2) The *Judges' Salaries Act 1920*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of July 1969.

2 Section two of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

"2. There is payable out of the Consolidated Revenue (which, to the necessary extent, is appropriated accordingly)— Judges' salaries.

(a) to the person for the time being holding the office of Chief Justice, a salary at the rate of eighteen thousand four hundred and fifty dollars a year; and

- (b) to each person for the time being holding the office of puisne judge, a salary at the rate of sixteen thousand six hundred and fifty dollars a year.”.

No. 10 of 1969.

AN ACT to amend the *Education Act* 1932.

[14 October 1969.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Education Act* 1969.

(2) The *Education Act* 1932, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
